

GLSA Score Sheet Rules

These rules apply to U-9 and above age groups (both boys and girls).

Each coach will present a completed GLSA Score Sheet to the referee or assistant referee before each game. **Only Official Score sheets will be accepted. One point (1) will be deducted if a tournament score sheet is used.** Score sheets must include age group, team name, jersey color, coach and asst. coach names, complete names of players with their jersey number, date, time of game, and field game is being played on. **The home team is always the first team listed on the schedule. For accurate scoring, please list the home team and visiting team. Example attached.**

At the end of the game, each coach must get his/her team score sheet from the referee or assistant referee. **Both coaches** must deposit their score sheet after each game in one of the locked score sheet boxes located near the concession stands.

Teams that play out-of-town teams or competitive teams as part of their schedule, the GLSA coach will turn in a score sheet. Competitive teams and out-of-town teams are required to use the GLSA Score Sheet, in case of cards, and deposit them after the games.

Points will be awarded as follows:

6 points for a win. 1 point per goal scored in the game, with a max. of 3.

3 points for a tie. 1 point for a shutout (not allowing opponent to score).

0 points for a loss. A forfeit will be scored as a 3-0 win.

Eight (8) blank score sheets can be found in the packet that coaches receive at the team assignment meeting and on the website. **They will no longer be available at the fields.**

Score sheets must be filled out completely before they are given to the referee or assistant referee. One (1) point will be deducted from the team's point total for score sheets that are not filled out completely. One (1) point will be deducted from the team's point total if player cards are found without a jersey number on them.

Score sheets and card write-ups will be collected on Saturday afternoons and late Sunday afternoons.

Score sheets may also be dropped off at the GLSA office or faxed to the GLSA office (903-756-2006) if not deposited at Lear Park. A coach will have 48 hours after his/her game to turn in late score sheets. One (1) point will be deducted from the team's point total after this time.

Scores and standings will be posted by Wednesday on our website (www.longviewsoccer.com), phone App (GLSA), and at Lear Park on Friday.

If a team is scheduled to play another team twice, but does not play all of the teams in their division twice, then the first game on the schedule will be designated as a non-league game. Only the score of the game will be posted, no points will be awarded, and nothing will be posted in the standings. Non-league games that are unable to be played will not be rescheduled. If a team does not show up to play a non-league game, then the coach will be fined \$20.

Longview teams playing an out-of-town team or competitive team will **receive no points** for the game, win, lose, or tie. If a **Longview team that does not show up to play an out-of-town team or competitive team, then the coach will be fined \$20.** If a score sheet is not turned in, teams will be penalized **one (1) point.**

An emergency score sheet will be available at the referee room but will cost \$5.00 to obtain one. If a coach has to purchase two (2), then he/she will be suspended a game. Two games without a score sheet will result in a one-game suspension.

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
